*The following will detail the joint investigative actions of the Ocean County Prosecutor's Office, New Jersey State Police, Manchester Police Department, and Federal Bureau of Investigation, and regarding the Murder of Kuldeep Kumar, herein referred to as the decedent. This appendix details the relevant information supporting probable cause for the arrest of Sourav Kumar and Gaurav Singh. Any mention to interviews should be considered abridged summaries, shortened for the necessity of brevity. All witness or suspect statements should be considered words to the effect unless marked with direct quotation.*

- A.** On Saturday, December 14, 2024, the Ocean County Prosecutor's Office Major Crime Unit was contacted by the Ocean County Sheriff's Department CSI in reference to a deceased individual who was located in Greenwood Wildlife Management Area off of Pasadena Road in Manchester Township, NJ (39.899583N, -74.4231944W). It was reported that an off-duty police officer (Det. Travis Seaman) was in the wooded area preparing to hunt when he came upon the deceased individual. Investigative personnel responded to the area to conduct the death investigation.
- B.** Upon arrival, investigators from the Ocean County Prosecutor's Office, Ocean County Sheriff's Department, New Jersey State Police Major Crime Unit and OCSO Crime Scene Investigations Unit, Manchester Police Department and the Conservation Police Department proceeded to the location and observed a deceased individual in advanced stages of decomposition. The body was clad in a blue shirt, green pants, and blue flip-flop style shoes. The decedent had a bracelet with two engraved names "Gurjeet" and "Kuldeep" on the right wrist. Four (4) 9mm shell casings were found in close proximity to the body. No trauma was able to be observed due to the decomposition and scavenger activity. Dr. Giles of the Ocean County Medical Examiner's Office responded to the scene and pronounced the decedent at 1805 hours. New Jersey State Police CSI responded to the scene and processed the decedent and the surrounding area. OCSO CSI ran a Leica scan of the scene. NJSP CSI collected the shell casings which will be entered into NIBIN. Oliverie Funeral Home responded and transported the decedent to Community Medical Center for post mortem examination. The scene was secured overnight for further processing.
- C.** On Sunday, December 15, 2024, Investigating Detectives conducted a grid search of the surrounding area of where the decedent was located. As a result of the search the following items of evidentiary value were collected: four (4) human teeth, an AirPods case containing one (1) headphone with a Serial #HOPLG9SULX2Y and one (1) additional bullet casing (9mm). Detectives attempted to identify the owner of the AirPods by scanning them in the

Bluetooth application through an Apple iPhone. As a result, the AirPods were detected under "Jai Balkari" name.

- D.** Detective Brylevskaya of the Ocean County Prosecutor's Office Major Crime Unit searched the meaning of "Jai Balkari" on Google. The search revealed that "Jai Balkari" is a slogan associated with the "Bishnoi gang", a criminal organization in India. The search also stated that the slogan is used to identify gang members and is often chanted before major tasks.
- E.** On Sunday, December 15, 2024 at approximately 0900 hours, Dr. Ragasa conducted a post mortem examination upon the decedent. Dr. Ragasa noted nicking to the ribs and sternum. He recovered one projectile from the chest cavity of the decedent. Dr. Ragasa ruled the cause of death to be GUNSHOT WOUNDS TO THE CHEST and the manner of death to be HOMICIDE. The skull of the decedent will be transported to Forensic Anthropologist Anna Delaney for further studies. Blood and urine were collected from the decedent for toxicology studies.
- F.** Several identification methods were utilized during the post mortem examination in attempt to identify the decedent. Special Agent Matt Amendola from FBI Newark responded and attempted to collect fingerprints to be read by an instant fingerprint reader which searches various law enforcement data bases. OCSO CSI Latent Fingerprint expert Caitlin McQuade also responded in order to collect fingerprints to send to AFIS.
- G.** After some time, Special Agent Matt Amendola contacted this writer and advised that the fingerprints of the decedent were identified as Kuldeep Kumar, DOB: [REDACTED]/1989. SA Amendola then contacted TFO Derek Kardos of the Enforcement and Removal Operations at US Immigration and Customs Enforcement in order to collect immigration information about the decedent. TFO Kardos provided an address of [REDACTED] Ozone Park, NY 11417 and a US point of contact for the decedent: Sanjeev Kumar with the above referenced address and cell phone [REDACTED]. ICE indicated that the decedent was detained for illegal entry into the US in Tucson, AZ in December of 2023, and then applied for I589 asylum/withholding of removal status in June of 2024.
- H.** On Sunday, December 15, 2024, Sergeant Uricks of the OCPO Major Crime Unit contacted 106<sup>th</sup> Precinct of the New York Police Department. Sergeant Uricks was advised that the decedent was reported missing on October 26, 2024 by the decedent's brother, identified as Sanjeev Kumar, DOB: [REDACTED] 1993 (NYPD Complaint #2024-106-007398). According to the NYPD Incident report, the reporting party stated the following: On October 22, 2024 during the evening hours, the decedent received a phone call from an individual (Sandeep Kumar) asking him to come outside. The decedent stated that he would be right back and got into a yellow taxi cab with the caller and has not returned since. The decedent was described wearing a blue shirt, black sweatpants and flip flops.

- I. Furthermore, Sergeant Uricks spoke with SDS Mario Di Leo of the NYPD Missing Persons Squad. SDS Di Leo reviewed the initial incident report and the missing person report generated by the Missing Persons Squad. It was relayed that the decedent was visiting from Maine and was scheduled to attend an Asylum meeting in Manhattan during his visit. The decedent's brother (Mr. Kumar) stated that on the evening of October 22nd, 2024 the decedent received a phone call from the decedent's wife's relative to come outside of the residence. Mr. Kumar states that the decedent entered the vehicle with the relative and left the location. Mr. Kumar stated that he has not heard from the decedent since he left that evening and that his cell phone is off. Mr. Kumar further informed that he had been in contact with the decedent's wife and that she has not heard from the decedent since the day he went missing.
- J. The address provided for the decedent was [REDACTED] Biddeford, Maine and telephone facility number [REDACTED]. Upon taking the missing person report, NYPD contacted Biddeford Police Department and requested a well fare check for the decedent at [REDACTED] Biddeford, Maine with negative results (Biddeford PD Call #24-39852).
- K. On Sunday, December 15, 2024, Investigating Detectives responded to the decedent's last known address located at [REDACTED] Ozone Park, NY 11417. Detectives made contact with the decedent's family members. It should be noted that the conversations with decedent's family members were translated from Punjabi with the assistance of NJSP Trooper Singh.
- L. Investigating Detectives spoke with the decedent's cousin, identified as Kuldip Singh, DOB: [REDACTED] 1980. In summary Singh stated the following: The decedent's brother (Sanjeev Kumar) currently lives in Indiana and only came to New York to report the decedent missing. Singh stated the decedent came to his residence on October 22<sup>nd</sup>, 2024 to stay over for a night and was scheduled to attend an Asylum meeting in Manhattan, on October 23, 2024. Singh further stated while cooking dinner on October 22<sup>nd</sup> 2024, for the decedent and his roommates, the decedent gets a call on his cellular phone and ran out of the 2<sup>nd</sup> floor of the residence in flip flops and got inside of a white vehicle, not a taxi cab as noted in the NYPD report. Singh stated that he has not heard from the decedent since he left in the white vehicle and that his cell phone is off.
- During the night of October 22<sup>nd</sup>, Singh received a phone call from decedent's wife from India. The wife advised Singh that the decedent got in the vehicle with Sandeep Kumar. She further stated she was FaceTiming the decedent and spoke with Sandeep Kumar in the vehicle.

At some point Singh spoke with Sandeep Kumar via cellular phone. Sandeep told Singh conflicting stories about where the decedent was dropped off. Further, Singh stated that he responded to NYPD to report the decedent missing. NYPD advised Singh only

immediate family members can file the missing report. At which time Singh notified the decedent's brother who arrived to New York to file the missing report.

- M.** Furthermore, Investigating Detectives contacted the decedent's bother, Mr. Kumar via telephone. Mr. Kumar was in Arizona for work. In summary Mr. Kumar stated the following: The decedent came to New York on October 22<sup>nd</sup>, 2024 to attend an Asylum meeting in Manhattan on October 23rd. On October 22, 2024, the decedent received a phone call from an individual (Sandeep Kumar) asking him to come outside. At which time, the decedent gets into a white in color vehicle and has not returned since. Kumar stated that he has not heard from the decedent since he left that evening.
- N.** Kumar further stated he received a call from an individual's Sourav and Gaurav on November 1<sup>st</sup>, 2024. During the phone call Sourav stated "your brother got what he deserved", "if we can kill one, we can kill more people", "Don't get involved with the cops and leave New York or will come for your family". Kumar advised that he video recorded the entire phone conversation. The video was forwarded to the Ocean County Prosecutors Office and submitted to evidence.
- O.** It was relayed that Sourav is the decedent's nephew. Sourav has a brother who was identified as Gaurav. Various law enforcement data base searches were conducted to include the assistance from the Federal Agencies on Sourav and Gaurav. Sourav was identified as Sourav Kumar, DOB: [REDACTED] 2000 out of [REDACTED] Hicksville, New York with a telephone facility number [REDACTED] serviced by T-Mobile. Gaurav was identified as Gaurav Singh, DOB: [REDACTED] 1997 (multiple addresses on file, to include [REDACTED] Greenwood, Indiana) with a telephone facility number [REDACTED] serviced by AT&T.
- P.** It should be noted that the decedent's family provided the description of the decedent's clothing on October 22, 2024 when he was last seen leaving the Apartment. The clothing description was consistent with the clothing he was located in on December 14, 2024 by members of the law enforcement. The decedent's family also provided a telephone facility number for Sandeep Kumar (herein referred to as the suspect) as [REDACTED]
- Q.** Furthermore, the victim's family also indicated that during the time they reported the decedent missing to the NYPD they made contact with a business located at [REDACTED] Ozone Park, New York. The business had a surveillance camera located on the outside of the dwelling. This writer reviewed the surveillance video dated October 22, 2024 at approximately 1713 hours. It was relayed that the time on the video was off by approximately 4 hours (the accurate time would be 2113 hours). This writer observed a white vehicle parked across the street from the victim's Apartment. The vehicle appeared to be on and had the rear lights on. After a short time, a male depicting the description of the victim walked from the direction of the victim's Apartment and walked toward the

white vehicle. The male walked to the driver's side of the vehicle and remained outside for several minutes. The male is then observed entering the back passenger seat of the vehicle (on the driver's side).

- R. During the course of the investigation, Detective Brylevskaya reviewed the incident report provided by the U.S. Department of Homeland Security (File # A245610372). The report described the illegal entry of the victim into the United States. The victim admitted to illegally crossing the border on 12/15/2023. The victim claimed to be from Senegal and stated that he does fear persecution to torture if returned to Senegal. It was confirmed through the investigation that the victim is from India and not Senegal. The victim provided an address of [REDACTED] Ozone Park, New York. The statements provided by the victim's family were consistent with what the victim told the Border Patrol Agent in regard to being in fear of prosecution or torture.
- S. This writer received intelligence from Intelligence Analyst Danielle Stovall of the FBI Transnational Organized Crime in reference to the Bishnoi Gang. It was relayed that the Lawrence Bishnoi Gang (LBG) operates in India, Canada and the US. The Gang is known to conduct violent extortions, murder-for-hire, narcotics trafficking, and financial scams targeting individuals in India. The LBG is associated with multiple murders, extortions, and narcotics smuggling in the US, Canada and India. Extortion victims in the US are primarily individuals of South Asian descent, and frequently small business owners who face retribution if they refuse to comply with LBG extortion demands. Retribution typically consists of the victim's homes or businesses in the US, Canada, or India being shot, or the kidnapping of family members still located within India.
- T. On Monday, December 16, 2024, NJSP Trooper Singh reviewed the recorded phone calls between decedent's family and Gaurav and Sourav as provided by decedent's sister-in-law, Manpreet Kaur. The information on these calls was consistent with the information previously reported by the decedent's family and noted above in Paragraph N. More Specifically, NJSP Trooper Singh translated the following statements made by Gaurav and Sourav:

"Don't take your brother's bad deeds on yourself"

"He got what he deserved"

"If you get involved in this, you will be responsible for anything that happens to you, wife, child" "We can kill you too"

"If we get arrested, revenge by others"

"We don't want what happened to brother to happen to you"

Moreover, Gaurav and Sourav indicated that they know where the family lives, where their child goes to school and Sanjeev Kumar's trucking company. Sourav also stated that he knows that Kumar was looking for surveillance when the decedent went missing.

- U. On Monday, December 16, 2024 Investigating Detectives conducted inquiries for all traffic summonses issued to Sourav Kumar. During the inquiry, it was revealed that Kumar was issued a traffic summons (#E24002674) in Hightstown Boro, in Mercer County, New Jersey, while operating a silver 2019 Audi Q8 bearing New Jersey registration [REDACTED]. An inquiry through the New Jersey Motor Vehicle Commission (NJ MVC) revealed the vehicle was registered to Sukhraj Singh (DOB [REDACTED] 1992) residing at [REDACTED] Newfield, NJ 08344. The summons was issued by Officer Townsend, of the Hightstown Police Department, on October 23, 2024 at approximately 2:09 AM.
- V. Subsequently, on December 16<sup>th</sup>, 2024 the Hightstown Police Department provided CAD information and Body Worn Camera footage in relation to a motor vehicle stop conducted upon NJ Registration: [REDACTED] on October 23<sup>rd</sup>, 2024 at approximately 0203 hrs. The motor vehicle stop was conducted in the area of South Main St., Hightstown Boro, NJ. Upon reviewing the BWC, the officer approaches the vehicle and makes contact with the driver, Sourav Kumar, who presents a NY Driver's License DL# [REDACTED]. During the motor vehicle stop, Kumar indicated that he was traveling from Vineland, NJ en route to New Brunswick, NJ. Kumar was issued two (2) motor vehicle summons during the encounter. It should be noted that there were two (2) additional occupants of the vehicle who were unable to be identified in the video. However, it was ascertained that neither of the occupants matched the physical description of the decedent (or his clothing he was wearing during the evening of October 22 when he left the Apartment in NY).
- W. Furthermore, Investigating Detectives requested Automated License Plate Reader (ALPR) results from the NYPD for the silver 2019 Audi Q8 bearing New Jersey registration [REDACTED]. Detective Patrick Sullivan, of the NYPD - Bronx Homicide Squad, provided all available results from January 2024 through December 2024. Based on the results, the vehicle was located in Patrol Borough Staten Island (PBSI) on October 22, 2024 at approximately 2216 hours. The location of the vehicle was listed at GPS coordinates 40.601907, -74.059682. Detectives used Google Maps which showed these coordinates placed the vehicle on Interstate 278 on the Staten Island side of the Verrazzano-Narrows Bridge. Detectives then used Google Maps to plot directions from the vehicle's location to [REDACTED] in Queens, where the decedent was last seen. Google Maps showed the time of travel to be approximately 50 minutes, which may vary based on time of day, volume of traffic, and weather conditions. It should be noted that the decedent was shown on surveillance video leaving [REDACTED] in the white SUV at approximately 2115 hours.
- X. Investigating Detectives conducted additional searches through various law enforcement data bases for the Audi Q8 New Jersey Registration: [REDACTED]. The search revealed an additional owner of the vehicle, identified as Deepak Tanwar, DOB: [REDACTED] 1998, residing at [REDACTED] Vineland, New Jersey. Detectives responded to [REDACTED] Vineland and located the vehicle parked in the driveway of the residence.

- Y.** While located at [REDACTED] Vineland, Investigating Detectives knocked on the door and attempted to make contact with the registered owner of the vehicle, with negative results. Once the Search Warrant was granted, the Audi Q8 bearing New Jersey Registration: [REDACTED] was towed to a secured location at the Buena Vista NJSP Headquarters. NJSP Trooper Kyle Leach followed the T Master's Towing and secured the vehicle, pending execution of the Search Warrant.
- Z.** During the course of the investigation, Task Force Officer Derek Kardos of the Enforcement and Removal Operations U.S. Immigration and Customs Enforcement conducted a search of the suspect's telephone facility number [REDACTED] through the ICE law enforcement data base. The search revealed the telephone facility number as a point of contact for an ICE detainee, identified as Parmod Kumar. TFO Kardos indicated that he located numerous jail calls between Parmod Kumar and the suspect.
- AA.** This writer requested the recordings of the jail calls between Parmod Kumar and the suspect. NJSP Trooper Singh reviewed the recordings and translated them. Specifically, Trooper Singh reviewed the jail call recording dated October 22nd, 2024 at 2118 hours. The phone call lasted 5 Minutes and 29 seconds. It should be noted October 22nd, 2024 is the date the decedent went missing.

During the phone call, Parmod Kumar was heard having a conversation with the suspect. The suspect then passed the phone off to the decedent. Parmod Kumar asked the decedent about his family and how he was doing in the US. After a brief conversation the phone was again passed off to Sandeep Kumar.

Trooper Singh reviewed a jail call recording dated October 26th, 2024 at 2248 hours which lasted 17 minutes and 33 seconds. During this conversation Parmod Kumar asked the suspect if he had any involvement with the decedent going missing, to which the suspect stated "I have no role but I'm the last person that spoke to the decedent on October 22nd, 2024". During this phone conversation, the suspect gives the phone to Gaurav. During their conversation, Parmod Kumar talks about his immigration case.

Trooper Singh indicated that during the multiple recorded jail call conversations between Parmod Kumar and the suspect, Parmod inquires about the decedent missing investigation. The suspect was heard multiple times saying "I don't know where he is, I dropped off at his residence on October 22nd, 2024".

- BB.** On Tuesday, December 17, 2024, Anish Deepak Tanwar (one of the registered owners of the Audi Q8) was contacted via telephone due to him being out of state as a truck driver. Trooper Singh made contact with him and Tanwar stated the following:
- i. Tanwar indicated he was in contact with Gaurav Singh on October 21, 2024 at approximately 3 AM via text when he advised that his brother,

Sourav Kumar, needed to borrow his white Audi to "take a girl on a date." Tanwar contacted Sourav Kumar and informed him that another friend, Pankaj Kumar, currently had the vehicle and was using it. Tanwar stated that Pankaj Kumar was a gas station attendant at the Shell Gas Station in Millville, New Jersey. Tanwar confirmed that Gaurav contacted him via telephone facility number [REDACTED]

- ii. Tanwar was then contacted by Sourav on October 21, 2024, at approximately 10:52 AM via telephone facility number [REDACTED]. They had a 3 minute phone call conversation. Sourav then texted Tanwar asking him for an address (presumably the location where to pick up the vehicle). Ultimately, Tanwar provided Sourav an address for the Shell Gas station, "812 N. 2<sup>nd</sup> Street, Millville, NJ 08332". On October 21, 2024, Tanwar sends a message to Sourav at 1:25 am "Bro's at the store I told him" (inferencing to the gas attendant who had the vehicle at that time)
- iii. A DMV inquiry for Pankaj Kumar showed him to have an address in Greenwood, Indiana. It should be noted that this is the same town Sourav Kumar and Gaurav Singh reside and where Sourav Kumar's cell phone is currently pinging.

**CC.** On Tuesday, December 17, 2024 Detectives from MCSU conducted interviews at the NJSP Buena Station with the following residents of [REDACTED] Vineland, which is where the suspect Audi Q8 was located and seized.

- i. Mushkanpal Kaur DOB: [REDACTED]/2003. During her interview, Kaur advised that the primary owner of the Audi Q8 was her husband, Anish Deepak Tanwar. She further advised that Tanwar allows for many friends and family to use the vehicle, on a regular basis. Kaur did not recognize any of the suspects names, and when shown photographs of the suspects using the vehicle she denied knowing who they were. She further stated she did not recall anyone in particular borrowing the vehicle at the end of October. Kaur stated her husband is a long haul trucker and presently out of state. She provided a phone number for him, with which detectives were able to contact him for a statement.
- ii. Rohan Pal DOB: [REDACTED] 1993. During his interview, Pal advised the primary owner of the Audi Q8 was his "cousin brother" Anish Deepak Tanwar. He stated that friends and family regularly use the vehicle. Pal did not recognize the suspects names, and when shown photographs of the suspects using the vehicle he denied knowing who they were. Pal stated that he did not recall anyone in particular borrowing the vehicle at the end of October.



- iii. Anu Miramwal DOB: [REDACTED] 1994. During her interview, Miramwal denied recognizing any of the suspects in the photos shown to her or having knowledge of who operated the Audi Q8 in October.

**DD.** On Tuesday, December 17, 2024, members of the NJSP MCSU, CSIU, and Ocean County Prosecutor's Office executed court authorized Search Warrant on the Audi Q8, New Jersey Registration: [REDACTED]. The search involved processing the vehicle for latent prints, DNA swabs, and Blue Star testing for blood evidence. As a result of the search the following items were located and seized: Four (4) black car floor mats with unknown stains - from trunk, One (1) plastic water bottle, opened - from rear passenger side door, One (1) tan pair of "LDECK" shoes with unknown stains - from trunk, One (1) black piece of string - from driver's side front bumper, One (1) swab of suspected biological matter - from rear passenger seat side, One (1) cargo net - from rear of front passenger's seat, One (1) cargo net - from rear of driver's seat, and Two (2) traffic summonses for Sourav Kumar from 11/15/2023 (operating a different vehicle) - from rear passenger's side door.

During the search, Investigating Detectives noted the four (4) car floor mats in heavily used condition were located in the trunk of the vehicle, and what appeared to be new and clean floor mats were located on the floorboards of the vehicle.

**EE.** Furthermore, Det. John Turner of Ocean County Prosecutors Office Hi-Tech Unit attempted to execute the court authorized search warrant on the infotainment system located within the Audi Q8. At this time, this was unsuccessful due to an unforeseen software update requirement. The software update was initiated.

**FF.** On Tuesday, December 17, 2024 Investigating Detectives made contact with the suspect (Sandeep Kumar). Investigating Detectives interviewed the suspect at the Port Authority Police Department at the JFK Airport in New York. The interview was audio and video recorded. Trooper Singh conducted the interview in Punjabi. Trooper Singh read the suspect his Miranda Rights (in Punjabi) and the suspect Trooper Singh advised that the suspect stated the following: On October 22, 2024 he was contacted on his cell phone by Sourav. Sourav stated he attempted to contact the decedent via telephone and the decedent hung up on him and blocked his number due to an on-going fight between the two. Sourav then contacted the suspect and informed him to come home and that Sourav would pick him up. Sourav and two unknown males picked the suspect up at his residence. The suspect described the vehicle as a silver type SUV. Once in the vehicle, Sourav, who was seated in the rear passenger seat, told the suspect to call the decedent and tell him to come outside. The suspect complied with the request and contacted the decedent. As the decedent exited his residence, the suspect stated he and the decedent had a conversation at the window. The suspect indicated that Sourav concealed his identity in the rear seat of the vehicle, due to the fact that if the decedent observed Sourav in the vehicle he would not have entered due to previous familial issues with Sourav and his sister.

The suspect explained that once the decedent was in the vehicle, Sourav and the decedent began to argue about familial issues and asked why he blocked his phone number and would not talk to him over the phone. They proceeded to a park and Sourav instructed the suspect to exit the vehicle. At which time, Sourav moved into the driver seat of the vehicle and they departed the area to an unknown destination. He explained that Sourav further communicated with him telephonically that the decedent was gone, and not coming back, but did not go into further detail. Sourav then threatened the suspect's life and his families' if he were to cooperate with law enforcement. He explained that earlier this month, Sourav requested to meet the suspect at the Rockefeller Center and further threatened the suspect and told him that the decedent was gone and would not be coming back.

Investigating Detectives seized the suspect's cell phone. Pending application of a search warrant.

**GG.** On Wednesday, December 18, 2024 NJSP MCSU Detectives utilized database inquiries to attempt to identify Pankaj Kumar, who was mentioned by Deepak Tanwar as having the silver Audi Q8 before Sourav Kumar. During their inquiries, and with assistance from Millville Police Department, Pankaj Kumar (DOB: ██████████ 1990) was positively identified and determined to be an employee at Shell Gas Station in Millville, located at 812 N. 2<sup>nd</sup> Street, Millville, New Jersey.

**HH.** On Wednesday, December 18, 2024 NJSP MCSU Detectives responded to Shell Gas Station in Millville, located at 812 N. 2<sup>nd</sup> Street, Millville, New Jersey. Detectives made contact with gas station attendant currently working, only identifying himself as Gourav and providing a date of birth as ██████████ 1996. In speaking with Gourav, he recalled that Pankaj Kumar had access to an Audi and was driving the vehicle at the end of October. Gourav recalled that the vehicle was parked at the gas station and then stated it was not there the next day. He asked Pankaj Kumar where the vehicle went, to which Pankaj Kumar stated that the vehicle owner, Deepak Tanwar, instructed him to let his friend borrow it. Gourav further stated that Pankaj Kumar works the night shift and would be working later.

**II.** On the same date, NJSP MCSU Detectives made contact with Pankaj Kumar (DOB: ██████████ 1990) at his residence located at ██████████ in Millville. While there, Pankaj Kumar conducted an interview with detectives. In speaking with Pankaj Kumar, he admitted to having the silver Audi around October 21-22, 2024. Pankaj Kumar stated that he was working at the Shell Gas Station when he got a call from Deepak Tanwar, who told Pankaj Kumar to let Deepak's friend borrow the car to take a girl on a date. Pankaj Kumar stated that a guy showed up by himself to get the car keys. Pankaj Kumar then confirmed with Deepak to give this individual the keys, so he complied. Pankaj Kumar stated this happened early in the morning, around 6:00 AM. Pankaj Kumar stated that the next morning, around 6:00-8:00 AM, the individual drops the car back off at the Shell Gas Station. Pankaj stated that he kept the car for another day before returning it. During interview, detectives showed a photograph of Sourav Kumar taken from the body-worn camera video from the Hightstown Police Department motor vehicle stop. In seeing the photograph, Pankaj Kumar identified the individual depicted as the individual who picked up the car. At the conclusion, Pankaj Kumar's cell phone, described as an

Apple iPhone, inside a black and white case, was seized as evidence pending application of a search warrant.

**JJ.** On Wednesday, December 18, 2024 at approximately 2042 hours, This writer received a telephone call from the decedent's brother, Sanjeev Kumar. Due to the language barrier, This writer requested that Trooper Singh of NJSP contact Sanjeev. Trooper Singh made contact with Sanjeev, who indicated that he received a threatening phone call from a friend of Sourav, who did not say his name. Sanjeev said that the unknown caller said that Sanjeev should go to the police and rescind the case, and that he should tell the police that Sanjeev located his brother in Canada. The individual further said that if he did not do so, that they would kill him and his family. Sanjeev said that he video recorded the phone call using another phone.

**KK.** On Thursday December, 19, 2024 Detective Brylevskaya received Communication Data records for Sourav's telephone facility number [REDACTED] from T-Mobile (as a result of the execution of court authorized CDW Order # GR-OCN-8042-CDW-24). The records were reviewed and interpreted by Agent Turner of the Ocean County Prosecutor's Office Hi-Tech Unit. Specifically, Agent Turner reviewed the Data Sessions records and confirmed that on October 23, 2024 at approximately 12:47:17 AM, Sourav's telephone facility number [REDACTED] was communicating with a tower in the area of where the decedent was located, Pasadena Road in Manchester Township, NJ (39.899583N, -74.4231944W).

**LL.** On Thursday, December 19, 2024 the facts of the investigation were reviewed with the Supervising Assistant Prosecutor Meghan O'Neill. As a result of the investigation, Supervising Assistant Prosecutor Meghan O'Neill authorized the following criminal complaints for Sourav Kumar: Murder—2C:11-3a(1), (2) and Conspiracy to Commit murder—2C:5-2 and 2C:11-3a(1), (2) and for Gaurav Singh: 2C:11-3a(1), (2) and Conspiracy to Commit murder—2C:5-2 and 2C:11-3a(1).

*The following will detail the joint investigative actions of the Ocean County Prosecutor's Office, New Jersey State Police, Manchester Police Department, and Federal Bureau of Investigation, and regarding the Murder of Kuldeep Kumar, herein referred to as the decedent. This appendix details the relevant information supporting probable cause for the arrest of Gurdeep Singh and Nirmal Singh. Any mention to interviews should be considered abridged summaries, shortened for the necessity of brevity. All witness or suspect statements should be considered words to the effect unless marked with direct quotation.*

On Saturday, December 14, 2024, the Ocean County Prosecutor's Office Major Crime Unit was contacted by the Ocean County Sheriff's Department CSI in reference to a deceased individual who was located in Greenwood Wildlife Management Area off of Pasadena Road in Manchester Township, NJ (39.899583N, -74.4231944W). It was reported that an off-duty police officer (Det. Travis Seaman) was in the wooded area preparing to hunt when he came upon the deceased individual. Investigative personnel responded to the area to conduct the death investigation.

Upon arrival, investigators from the Ocean County Prosecutor's Office, Ocean County Sheriff's Department, New Jersey State Police Major Crime Unit and OCSO Crime Scene Investigations Unit, Manchester Police Department and the Conservation Police Department proceeded to the location and observed a deceased individual in advanced stages of decomposition. The body was clad in a blue shirt, green pants, and blue flip-flop style shoes. The decedent had a bracelet with two engraved names "Gurjeet" and "Kuldeep" on the right wrist. Four (4) 9mm shell casings were found in close proximity to the body. No trauma was able to be observed due to the decomposition and scavenger activity. Dr. Giles of the Ocean County Medical Examiner's Office responded to the scene and pronounced the decedent at 1805 hours. New Jersey State Police CSI responded to the scene and processed the decedent and the surrounding area. OCSD CSI ran a Leica scan of the scene. NJSP CSI collected the shell casings which will be entered into NIBIN. Oliverie Funeral Home responded and transported the decedent to Community Medical Center for post mortem examination. The scene was secured overnight for further processing.

On Sunday, December 15, 2024, Investigating Detectives conducted a grid search of the surrounding area of where the decedent was located. As a result of the search the following items of evidentiary value were collected: four (4) human teeth, an AirPods case containing one (1) headphone with a Serial #HOPLG9SULX2Y and one (1) additional bullet casing (9mm). Detectives attempted to identify the owner of the AirPods by scanning them in the Bluetooth application through an Apple iPhone. As a result, the AirPods were detected under "Jai Balkari" name.

Detective Brylevskaya of the Ocean County Prosecutor's Office Major Crime Unit searched the meaning of "Jai Balkari" on Google. The search revealed that "Jai Balkari" is a slogan associated with the "Bishnoi gang", a criminal organization in India. The search also stated that the slogan is used to identify gang members and is often chanted before major tasks.

On Sunday, December 15, 2024 at approximately 0900 hours, Dr. Ragasa conducted a post mortem examination upon the decedent. Dr. Ragasa noted nicking to the ribs and sternum. He recovered one projectile from the chest cavity of the decedent. Dr. Ragasa ruled the cause of death to be GUNSHOT WOUNDS TO THE CHEST and the manner of death to be HOMICIDE. The skull of the decedent will be transported to Forensic Anthropologist Anna Delaney for further studies. Blood and urine were collected from the decedent for toxicology studies.

Several identification methods were utilized during the post mortem examination in attempt to identify the decedent. Special Agent Matt Amendola from FBI Newark responded and attempted to collect fingerprints to be read by an instant fingerprint reader which searches various law enforcement data bases. OCSO CSI Latent Fingerprint expert Caitlin McQuade also responded in order to collect fingerprints to send to AFIS.

After some time, Special Agent Matt Amendola contacted this writer and advised that the fingerprints of the decedent were identified as Kuldeep Kumar, DOB [REDACTED]/1989. SA Amendola then contacted TFO Derek Kardos of the Enforcement and Removal Operations at US Immigration and Customs Enforcement in order to collect immigration information about the decedent. TFO Kardos provided an address of [REDACTED] Ozone Park, NY 11417 and a US point of contact for the decedent: Sanjeev Kumar with the above referenced address and cell phone [REDACTED]. ICE indicated that the decedent was detained for illegal entry into the US in Tucson, AZ in December of 2023, and then applied for I589 asylum/withholding of removal status in June of 2024.

On Sunday, December 15, 2024, Sergeant Uricks of the OCPO Major Crime Unit contacted 106<sup>th</sup> Precinct of the New York Police Department. Sergeant Uricks was advised that the decedent was reported missing on October 26, 2024 by the decedent's brother, identified as Sanjeev Kumar, DOB [REDACTED]/1993 (NYPD Complaint #2024-106-007398). According to the NYPD Incident report, the reporting party stated the following: On October 22, 2024 during the evening hours, the decedent received a phone call from an individual (Sandeep Kumar) asking him to come outside. The decedent stated that he would be right back and got into a yellow taxi cab with the caller and has not returned since. The decedent was described wearing a blue shirt, black sweatpants and flip flops.

Furthermore, Sergeant Uricks spoke with SDS Mario Di Leo of the NYPD Missing Persons Squad. SDS Di Leo reviewed the initial incident report and the missing person report generated by the Missing Persons Squad. It was relayed that the decedent was visiting from Maine and was scheduled to attend an Asylum meeting in Manhattan during his visit. The decedent's brother (Mr. Kumar) stated that on the evening of October 22nd, 2024 the decedent received a phone call from

the decedent's wife's relative to come outside of the residence. Mr. Kumar states that the decedent entered the vehicle with the relative and left the location. Mr. Kumar stated that he has not heard from the decedent since he left that evening and that his cell phone is off. Mr. Kumar further informed that he had been in contact with the decedent's wife and that she has not heard from the decedent since the day he went missing.

The address provided for the decedent was [REDACTED] Biddeford, Maine and telephone facility number [REDACTED]. Upon taking the missing person report, NYPD contacted Biddeford Police Department and requested a well fare check for the decedent at [REDACTED] Biddeford, Maine with negative results (Biddeford PD Call #24-39852).

On Sunday, December 15, 2024, Investigating Detectives responded to the decedent's last known address located at [REDACTED] Ozone Park, NY 11417. Detectives made contact with the decedent's family members. It should be noted that the conversations with decedent's family members were translated from Punjabi with the assistance of NJSP Trooper Singh.

Investigating Detectives spoke with the decedent's cousin, identified as Kuldip Singh, DOB: [REDACTED] 1980. In summary Singh stated the following: The decedent's brother (Sanjeev Kumar) currently lives in Indiana and only came to New York to report the decedent missing. Singh stated the decedent came to his residence on October 22<sup>nd</sup>, 2024 to stay over for a night and was scheduled to attend an Asylum meeting in Manhattan, on October 23, 2024. Singh further stated while cooking dinner on October 22<sup>nd</sup> 2024, for the decedent and his roommates, the decedent gets a call on his cellular phone and ran out of the 2<sup>nd</sup> floor of the residence in flip flops and got inside of a white vehicle, not a taxi cab as noted in the NYPD report. Singh stated that he has not heard from the decedent since he left in the white vehicle and that his cell phone is off.

During the night of October 22<sup>nd</sup>, Singh received a phone call from decedent's wife from India. The wife advised Singh that the decedent got in the vehicle with Sandeep Kumar. She further stated she was FaceTiming the decedent and spoke with Sandeep Kumar in the vehicle.

At some point Singh spoke with Sandeep Kumar via cellular phone. Sandeep told Singh conflicting stories about where the decedent was dropped off. Further, Singh stated that he responded to NYPD to report the decedent missing. NYPD advised Singh only immediate family members can file the missing report. At which time Singh notified the decedent's brother who arrived to New York to file the missing report.

Furthermore, Investigating Detectives contacted the decedent's bother, Mr. Kumar via telephone. Mr. Kumar was in Arizona for work. In summary Mr. Kumar stated the following: The decedent came to New York on October 22<sup>nd</sup>, 2024 to attend an Asylum meeting in Manhattan on October 23<sup>rd</sup>. On October 22, 2024, the decedent received a phone call from an individual (Sandeep Kumar) asking him to come outside. At which time, the decedent gets into a white in color vehicle

and has not returned since. Kumar stated that he has not heard from the decedent since he left that evening.

Kumar further stated he received a call from an individual's Sourav and Gaurav on

November 1<sup>st</sup>, 2024. During the phone call Sourav stated "your brother got what he deserved", "if we can kill one, we can kill more people", "Don't get involved with the cops and leave New York or will come for your family". Kumar advised that he video recorded the entire phone conversation. The video was forwarded to the Ocean County Prosecutors Office and submitted to evidence.

It was relayed that Sourav is the decedent's nephew. Sourav has a brother who was identified as Gaurav. Various law enforcement data base searches were conducted to include the assistance from the Federal Agencies on Sourav and Gaurav. Sourav was identified as Sourav Kumar, DOB: [REDACTED] 2000 out of [REDACTED] Hicksville, New York with a telephone facility number [REDACTED] serviced by T-Mobile. Gaurav was identified as Gaurav Singh, DOB: [REDACTED] 1997 (multiple addresses on file, to include [REDACTED] Greenwood, Indiana) with a telephone facility number [REDACTED] serviced by AT&T.

It should be noted that the decedent's family provided the description of the decedent's clothing on October 22, 2024 when he was last seen leaving the Apartment. The clothing description was consistent with the clothing he was located in on December 14, 2024 by members of the law enforcement. The decedent's family also provided a telephone facility number for Sandeep Kumar as [REDACTED].

Furthermore, the victim's family also indicated that during the time they reported the decedent missing to the NYPD they made contact with a business located at 103-59 100<sup>th</sup> Street, Ozone Park, New York. The business had a surveillance camera located on the outside of the dwelling. This writer reviewed the surveillance video dated October 22, 2024 at approximately 1713 hours. It was relayed that the time on the video was off by approximately 4 hours (the accurate time would be 2113 hours). This writer observed a white vehicle parked across the street from the victim's Apartment. The vehicle appeared to be on and had the rear lights on. After a short time, a male depicting the description of the victim walked from the direction of the victim's Apartment and walked toward the white vehicle. The male walked to the driver's side of the vehicle and remained outside for several minutes. The male is then observed entering the back passenger seat of the vehicle (on the driver's side).

During the course of the investigation, Detective Brylevskaya reviewed the incident report provided by the U.S. Department of Homeland Security (File # A245610372). The report described the illegal entry of the victim into the United States. The victim admitted to illegally crossing the border on 12/15/2023. The victim claimed to be from Senegal and stated that he does fear persecution to torture if returned to Senegal. It was confirmed through the investigation that the victim is from India and not Senegal. The victim provided an address of [REDACTED].

██████████ Ozone Park, New York. The statements provided by the victim's family were consistent with what the victim told the Border Patrol Agent in regard to being in fear of prosecution or torture.

This writer received intelligence from Intelligence Analyst Danielle Stovall of the FBI Transnational Organized Crime in reference to the Bishnoi Gang. It was relayed that the Lawrence Bishnoi Gang (LBG) operates in India, Canada and the US. The Gang is known to conduct violent extortions, murder-for-hire, narcotics trafficking, and financial scams targeting individuals in India. The LBG is associated with multiple murders, extortions, and narcotics smuggling in the US, Canada and India. Extortion victims in the US are primarily individuals of South Asian descent, and frequently small business owners who face retribution if they refuse to comply with LBG extortion demands. Retribution typically consists of the victim's homes or businesses in the US, Canada, or India being shot, or the kidnapping of family members still located within India.

On Monday, December 16, 2024, NJSP Trooper Singh reviewed the recorded phone calls between decedent's family and Gaurav and Sourav as provided by decedent's sister-in-law, Manpreet Kaur. The information on these calls was consistent with the information previously reported by the decedent's family and noted above in Paragraph N. More Specifically, NJSP Trooper Singh translated the following statements made by Gaurav and Sourav:

“Don't take your brother's bad deeds on yourself”

“He got what he deserved”

“If you get involved in this, you will be responsible for anything that happens to you, wife, child” “We can kill you too”

“If we get arrested, revenge by others”

“We don't want what happened to brother to happen to you”

Moreover, Gaurav and Sourav indicated that they know where the family lives, where their child goes to school and Sanjeev Kumar's trucking company. Sourav also stated that he knows that Kumar was looking for surveillance when the decedent went missing.

On Monday, December 16, 2024 Investigating Detectives conducted inquiries for all traffic summonses issued to Sourav Kumar. During the inquiry, it was revealed that Kumar was issued a traffic summons (#E24002674) in Hightstown Boro, in Mercer County, New Jersey, while operating a silver 2019 Audi Q8 bearing New Jersey registration ██████████. An inquiry through the New Jersey Motor Vehicle Commission (NJ MVC) revealed the vehicle was registered to Sukhraj Singh (DOB: ██████████ 1992) residing at ██████████ Newfield, NJ 08344. The summons was issued by Officer Townsend, of the Hightstown Police Department, on October 23, 2024 at approximately 2:09 AM.

Subsequently, on December 16<sup>th</sup>, 2024 the Hightstown Police Department provided CAD information and Body Worn Camera footage in relation to a motor vehicle stop conducted upon NJ Registration: ██████████ on October 23<sup>rd</sup>, 2024 at approximately 0203 hrs. The motor vehicle



stop was conducted in the area of South Main St., Hightstown Boro, NJ. Upon reviewing the BWC, the officer approaches the vehicle and makes contact with the driver, Sourav Kumar, who presents a NY Driver's License DL#: [REDACTED]. During the motor vehicle stop, Kumar indicated that he was traveling from Vineland, NJ en route to New Brunswick, NJ. Kumar was issued two (2) motor vehicle summons during the encounter. It should be noted that there were two (2) additional occupants of the vehicle who were unable to be identified in the video. However, it was ascertained that neither of the occupants matched the physical description of the decedent (or his clothing he was wearing during the evening of October 22 when he left the Apartment in NY).

Furthermore, Investigating Detectives requested Automated License Plate Reader (ALPR) results from the NYPD for the silver 2019 Audi Q8 bearing New Jersey registration [REDACTED]. Detective Patrick Sullivan, of the NYPD - Bronx Homicide Squad, provided all available results from January 2024 through December 2024. Based on the results, the vehicle was located in Patrol Borough Staten Island (PBSI) on October 22, 2024 at approximately 2216 hours. The location of the vehicle was listed at GPS coordinates 40.601907, -74.059682. Detectives used Google Maps which showed these coordinates placed the vehicle on Interstate 278 on the Staten Island side of the Verrazzano-Narrows Bridge. Detectives then used Google Maps to plot directions from the vehicle's location to [REDACTED] in Queens, where the decedent was last seen. Google Maps showed the time of travel to be approximately 50 minutes, which may vary based on time of day, volume of traffic, and weather conditions. It should be noted that the decedent was shown on surveillance video leaving [REDACTED] in the white SUV at approximately 2115 hours.

Investigating Detectives conducted additional searches through various law enforcement data bases for the Audi Q8 New Jersey Registration: [REDACTED]. The search revealed an additional owner of the vehicle, identified as Deepak Tanwar, DOB: [REDACTED] 1998, residing at [REDACTED] Vineland, New Jersey. Detectives responded to [REDACTED] Vineland and located the vehicle parked in the driveway of the residence.

While located at [REDACTED] Vineland, Investigating Detectives knocked on the door and attempted to make contact with the registered owner of the vehicle, with negative results. Once the Search Warrant was granted, the Audi Q8 bearing New Jersey Registration: [REDACTED] was towed to a secured location at the Buena Vista NJSP Headquarters. NJSP Trooper Kyle Leach followed the T Master's Towing and secured the vehicle, pending execution of the Search Warrant.

During the course of the investigation, Task Force Officer Derek Kardos of the Enforcement and Removal Operations U.S. Immigration and Customs Enforcement conducted a search of Sandeep's telephone facility number [REDACTED] through the ICE law enforcement data base. The search revealed the telephone facility number as a point of contact for an ICE detainee, identified as Parmod Kumar. TFO Kardos indicated that he located numerous jail calls between Parmod Kumar and Sandeep.

This writer requested the recordings of the jail calls between Parmod Kumar and Sandeep. NJSP Trooper Singh reviewed the recordings and translated them. Specifically, Trooper Singh reviewed

the jail call recording dated October 22nd, 2024 at 2118 hours. The phone call lasted 5 Minutes and 29 seconds. It should be noted October 22nd, 2024 is the date the decedent went missing.

During the phone call, Parmod Kumar was heard having a conversation with Sandeep. Sandeep then passed the phone off to the decedent. Parmod Kumar asked the decedent about his family and how he was doing in the US. After a brief conversation the phone was again passed off to Sandeep Kumar.

Trooper Singh reviewed a jail call recording dated October 26th, 2024 at 2248 hours which lasted 17 minutes and 33 seconds. During this conversation, Parmod Kumar asked Sandeep if he were involved with the decedent going missing, to which Sandeep stated "I have no role but I'm the last person that spoke to the decedent on October 22nd, 2024". During this phone conversation, Sandeep gives the phone to Gaurav. During their conversation, Parmod Kumar talks about his immigration case.

Trooper Singh indicated that during the multiple recorded jail call conversations between Parmod Kumar and Sandeep, Parmod inquires about the decedent missing investigation. Sandeep was heard multiple times saying "I don't know where he is, I dropped off at his residence on October 22nd, 2024".

On Tuesday, December 17, 2024, Anish Deepak Tanwar (one of the registered owners of the Audi Q8) was contacted via telephone due to him being out of state as a truck driver. Trooper Singh made contact with him and Tanwar stated the following:

- i. Tanwar indicated he was in contact with Gaurav Singh on October 21, 2024 at approximately 3 AM via text when he advised that his brother, Sourav Kumar, needed to borrow his white Audi to "take a girl on a date." Tanwar contacted Sourav Kumar and informed him that another friend, Pankaj Kumar, currently had the vehicle and was using it. Tanwar stated that Pankaj Kumar was a gas station attendant at the Shell Gas Station in Millville, New Jersey. Tanwar confirmed that Gaurav contacted him via telephone facility number [REDACTED]
- ii. Tanwar was then contacted by Sourav on October 21, 2024, at approximately 10:52 AM via telephone facility number [REDACTED]. They had a 3 minute phone call conversation. Sourav then texted Tanwar asking him for an address (presumably the location where to pick up the vehicle). Ultimately, Tanwar provided Sourav an address for the Shell Gas station, "812 N. 2<sup>nd</sup> Street, Millville, NJ 08332". On October 21, 2024, Tanwar sends a message to Sourav at 1:25 am "Bro's at the store I told him" (inferencing to the gas attendant who had the vehicle at that time)
- iii. A DMV inquiry for Pankaj Kumar showed him to have an address in

- Greenwood, Indiana. It should be noted that this is the same town Sourav Kumar and Gaurav Singh reside and where Sourav Kumar's cell phone is currently pinging.

On Tuesday, December 17, 2024 Detectives from MCSU conducted interviews at the NJSP Buena Station with the following residents of [REDACTED] Vineland, which is where the Audi Q8 was located and seized.

- iv. Mushkanpal Kaur DOB [REDACTED]/2003. During her interview, Kaur advised that the primary owner of the Audi Q8 was her husband, Anish Deepak Tanwar. She further advised that Tanwar allows for many friends and family to use the vehicle, on a regular basis. Kaur did not recognize any of the suspects names, and when shown photographs of the suspects using the vehicle she denied knowing who they were. She further stated she did not recall anyone in particular borrowing the vehicle at the end of October. Kaur stated her husband is a long haul trucker and presently out of state. She provided a phone number for him, with which detectives were able to contact him for a statement.
- v. Rohan Pal DOB: [REDACTED]/1993. During his interview, Pal advised the primary owner of the Audi Q8 was his "cousin brother" Anish Deepak Tanwar. He stated that friends and family regularly use the vehicle. Pal did not recognize the suspects names, and when shown photographs of the suspects using the vehicle he denied knowing who they were. Pal stated that he did not recall anyone in particular borrowing the vehicle at the end of October.
- vi. Anu Miramwal DOB [REDACTED] 1994. During her interview, Miramwal denied recognizing any of the suspects in the photos shown to her or having knowledge of who operated the Audi Q8 in October.

On Tuesday, December 17, 2024, members of the NJSP MCSU, CSIU, and Ocean County Prosecutor's Office executed court authorized Search Warrant on the Audi Q8, New Jersey Registration: [REDACTED]. The search involved processing the vehicle for latent prints, DNA swabs, and Blue Star testing for blood evidence. As a result of the search the following items were located and seized: Four (4) black car floor mats with unknown stains - from trunk, One (1) plastic water bottle, opened - from rear passenger side door, One (1) tan pair of "LDECK" shoes with unknown stains - from trunk, One (1) black piece of string - from driver's side front bumper, One (1) swab of suspected biological matter - from rear passenger seat side, One (1) cargo net - from rear of front passenger's seat, One (1) cargo net - from rear of driver's seat, and Two (2) traffic summonses for Sourav Kumar from 11/15/2023 (operating a different vehicle) - from rear passenger's side door.

During the search, Investigating Detectives noted the four (4) car floor mats in heavily used condition were located in the trunk of the vehicle, and what appeared to be new and clean floor mats were located on the floorboards of the vehicle.

Furthermore, Det. John Turner of Ocean County Prosecutors Office Hi-Tech Unit attempted to execute the court authorized search warrant on the infotainment system located within the Audi Q8. At this time, this was unsuccessful due to an unforeseen software update requirement. The software update was initiated.

On Tuesday, December 17, 2024 Investigating Detectives made contact with the Sandeep Kumar. Investigating Detectives interviewed Sandeep at the Port Authority Police Department at the JFK Airport in New York. The interview was audio and video recorded. Trooper Singh conducted the interview in Punjabi. Trooper Singh read Sandeep his Miranda Rights (in Punjabi) and Sandeep waived his rights. Trooper Singh advised that the Sandeep stated the following: On October 22, 2024 he was contacted on his cell phone by Sourav. Sourav stated he attempted to contact the decedent via telephone and the decedent hung up on him and blocked his number due to an on-going fight between the two. Sourav then contacted the Sandeep and informed him to come home and that Sourav would pick him up. Sourav and two unknown males picked the Sandeep up at his residence. The Sandeep described the vehicle as a silver type SUV. Once in the vehicle, Sourav, who was seated in the rear passenger seat, told the Sandeep to call the decedent and tell him to come outside. The Sandeep complied with the request and contacted the decedent. As the decedent exited his residence, the Sandeep stated he and the decedent had a conversation at the window. The Sandeep indicated that Sourav concealed his identity in the rear seat of the vehicle, due to the fact that if the decedent observed Sourav in the vehicle he would not have entered due to previous familial issues with Sourav and his sister.

Sandeep explained that once the decedent was in the vehicle, Sourav and the decedent began to argue about familial issues and asked why he blocked his phone number and would not talk to him over the phone. They proceeded to a park and Sourav instructed the Sandeep to exit the vehicle. At which time, Sourav moved into the driver seat of the vehicle and they departed the area to an unknown destination. He explained that Sourav further communicated with him telephonically that the decedent was gone, and not coming back, but did not go into further detail. Sourav then threatened the Sandeep's life and his families' if he were to cooperate with law enforcement. He explained that earlier this month, Sourav requested to meet the Sandeep at the Rockefeller Center and further threatened the Sandeep and told him that the decedent was gone and would not be coming back.

On Wednesday, December 18, 2024 NJSP MCSU Detectives utilized database inquiries to attempt to identify Pankaj Kumar, who was mentioned by Deepak Tanwar as having the silver Audi Q8 before Sourav Kumar. During their inquiries, and with assistance from Millville Police Department, Pankaj Kumar (DOB: [REDACTED] 1990) was positively identified and determined to be an employee at Shell Gas Station in Millville, located at 812 N. 2<sup>nd</sup> Street, Millville, New Jersey.

On Wednesday, December 18, 2024 NJSP MCSU Detectives responded to Shell Gas Station in Millville, located at 812 N. 2<sup>nd</sup> Street, Millville, New Jersey. Detectives made contact with gas station attendant currently working, only identifying himself as Gourav and providing a date of birth as [REDACTED] 1996. In speaking with Gourav, he recalled that Pankaj Kumar had access to an Audi and was driving the vehicle at the end of October. Gourav recalled that the vehicle was parked at the gas station and then stated it was not there the next day. He asked Pankaj Kumar where the vehicle went, to which Pankaj Kumar stated that the vehicle owner, Deepak Tanwar, instructed him to let his friend borrow it. Gourav further stated that Pankaj Kumar works the night shift and would be working later.

On the same date, NJSP MCSU Detectives made contact with Pankaj Kumar (DOB: [REDACTED]/1990) at his residence located at [REDACTED] in Millville. While there, Pankaj Kumar conducted an interview with detectives. In speaking with Pankaj Kumar, he admitted to having the silver Audi around October 21-22, 2024. Pankaj Kumar stated that he was working at the Shell Gas Station when he got a call from Deepak Tanwar, who told Pankaj Kumar to let Deepak's friend borrow the car to take a girl on a date. Pankaj Kumar stated that a guy showed up by himself to get the car keys. Pankaj Kumar then confirmed with Deepak to give this individual the keys, so he complied. Pankaj Kumar stated this happened early in the morning, around 6:00 AM. Pankaj Kumar stated that the next morning, around 6:00-8:00 AM, the individual drops the car back off at the Shell Gas Station. Pankaj stated that he kept the car for another day before returning it. During interview, detectives showed a photograph of Sourav Kumar taken from the body-worn camera video from the Hightstown Police Department motor vehicle stop. In seeing the photograph, Pankaj Kumar identified the individual depicted as the individual who picked up the car. At the conclusion, Pankaj Kumar's cell phone, described as an Apple iPhone, inside a black and white case, was seized as evidence pending application of a search warrant.

On Wednesday, December 18, 2024 at approximately 2042 hours, This writer received a telephone call from the decedent's brother, Sanjeev Kumar. Due to the language barrier, This writer requested that Trooper Singh of NJSP contact Sanjeev. Trooper Singh made contact with Sanjeev, who indicated that he received a threatening phone call from a friend of Sourav, who did not say his name. Sanjeev said that the unknown caller said that Sanjeev should go to the police and rescind the case, and that he should tell the police that Sanjeev located his brother in Canada. The individual further said that if he did not do so, that they would kill him and his family. Sanjeev said that he video recorded the phone call using another phone.

On Thursday December, 19, 2024 Detective Brylevskaya received Communication Data records for Sourav's telephone facility number [REDACTED] from T-Mobile (as a result of the execution of court authorized CDW Order # GR-OCN-8042-CDW-24). The records were reviewed and interpreted by Agent Turner of the Ocean County Prosecutor's Office Hi-Tech Unit. Specifically, Agent Turner reviewed the Data Sessions records and confirmed that on October 23, 2024 at approximately 12:47:17 AM, Sourav's telephone facility number [REDACTED] was communicating with a tower in the area of where the decedent was located, Pasadena Road in Manchester Township, NJ (39.899583N, -74.4231944W).

On Thursday, December 19, 2024 the facts of the investigation were reviewed with the Supervising Assistant Prosecutor Meghan O'Neill. As a result of the investigation, Supervising Assistant Prosecutor Meghan O'Neill authorized the following criminal complaints for Sourav Kumar: Murder—2C:11-3a(1), (2) and Conspiracy to Commit murder—2C:5-2 and 2C:11-3a(1), (2) and for Gaurav Singh: 2C:11-3a(1), (2) and Conspiracy to Commit murder—2C:5-2 and 2C:11-3a(1).

During the course of the investigation, Detective Mitchell of the Ocean County Prosecutor's Office Major Crime Unit received additional information from NYPD in reference to the original missing person case in regard to the decedent. It was learned that on October 24, 2024 at approximately 1823 hours NYPD received a 911 call from telephone facility number [REDACTED]. The caller identified himself as "Sandeep Kumar". Kumar called 911 to report the decedent missing (who was last seen on 10/22 at 2100 hours). During the call, Kumar indicated that he was located inside a yellow cab NY registration: [REDACTED], in the area of 95 Avenue and 127 Street, and requested Hindi interpreter.

On Friday, December 20<sup>th</sup>, 2024, the Federal Bureau of Investigation, Indianapolis Field Office conducted a court authorized arrest warrant at [REDACTED] Greenwood, Indiana, which was identified as the residence that Sourav Kumar and Gaurav Singh were currently living in. As a result of the search warrant, both parties were taken into custody without incident. Also located in the house were four individuals, identified as: Nirmal Singh (DOB [REDACTED]/1994), Gurdeep Singh (DOB: [REDACTED]/1992), Ravinder Kumar (DOB [REDACTED]/1995) and Gourav (DOB: [REDACTED]/1998). All parties were detained on scene and transported back to the Greenwood Police Department in order to attempt to obtain formal statements.

On December 20, 2024, Deputy Chief Aaron Hagist of the Greenwood Police Department applied for a court authorized search warrant for [REDACTED] Greenwood, Indiana. The warrant was approved by Judge Brandi Foster-Kirkendall. Several items of evidentiary value were recovered during execution of the search warrant, to include but not limited to:

*-mail linking Sourav Kumar to the residence*

*-various ammunition shell casings*

*-numerous electronic devices to include cell phones and laptops attributed to all of the parties within the residence*

*-one round of live ammunition*

*-notebooks*

This writer, along with FBI Community Outreach Specialist Sukhvir Kaur spoke with Nirmal Singh, Gurdeep Singh, Ravinder Kumar and Gourav and individually requested that each of them provide consent to collect their fingerprints and buccal swabs. All four individuals voluntarily provided their DNA exemplars and fingerprints. The consents were documented on body worn camera.

Case detectives conducted an interview of suspect Sourav Kumar, which was led by Trooper Singh. Miranda was read in Punjabi and waived by this individual. During the interview, Sourav denied knowing Kuldeep Kumar, the decedent. Sourav continued to be deceptive and provide multiple stories throughout the interview. None of the information provided matched case evidence compiled throughout the investigation. When confronted with the locational data from his cellular device, Sourav eventually admitted to being at the crime scene. Sourav stated that he, Gurdeep, and Nirmal went to NY where they picked up Sandeep Kumar (previously interviewed). Sandeep then drove the vehicle to pick up the decedent. During the drive, the occupants were all threatening the decedent and forcing him to admit to the crimes against Sourav's sister. The decedent allegedly stated that he will confess to everything and they can punish him however they wish. They then drove to the crime scene where Sourav, Sandeep, and the decedent exited the vehicle. Sourav then admitted that he ordered Sandeep to kill the decedent. Sourav then entered the driver seat of the vehicle and watched Sandeep walk the decedent into the wooded area, hearing multiple gunshots. Sourav and the others then drove towards Hightstown, NJ where Sandeep exited the vehicle and took a yellow taxi back to NY. Sourav stated they were stopped by police shortly after. Sourav admitted to purchasing the gun and providing it to Sandeep to commit the killing. Sourav stated that Sandeep kept the gun when he left the others.

Based on this interview, two detained subjects located at the residence, Gurdeep and Nirmal Singh, were identified as suspects due to them being in the vehicle on the night of the murder of Kuldeep Kumar. Sourav was shown images from the Hightstown PD BWC video where he identified each of them and signed the photographs.

Case detectives conducted an interview of suspect Gaurav Singh, which was led by Trooper Singh. Miranda was read in Punjabi and waived by this individual. During the interview, Gaurav denied knowing Kuldeep, the decedent, and denied knowing any circumstances surrounding his death. Gaurav additionally was unclear as to the situation between their sister and Kuldeep. Detectives played one of the threatening recordings obtained from Sanjeev Kumar (decedent's brother), where Gaurav identified Sourav as one of the voices on the call. Gaurav denied his voice being on the calls, which was now corroborated by detectives.

Case detectives conducted an interview of suspect Nirmal Singh, which was led by Trooper Singh. Miranda was read in Punjabi and waived by this individual. During the interview, Singh admitted to traveling with Saurav and Gurdeep to New York in the Chevy. He indicated that during the drive, they conspired to kill Kuldeep. He said that on the 22nd of October, he, along with Sourav and Gurdeep traveled to New York City. He said once in New York City, they picked up Sandeep Kumar at his house. He said that they then proceeded to the house that Kuldeep was staying at and Sandeep called him to come downstairs. Nirmal said that Sourav was driving the vehicle at the time they arrived at Kuldeep's house. He said that when they arrived, Sourav told Kuldeep that they needed to talk and Kuldeep entered the car. He said that they drove to a wooded area, later identified as the area where the murder occurred, and that while in route, Sourav confronted Kuldeep about Sourav's sister's death. Nirmal said that Kuldeep confessed to having something to do with the death of Sourav's sister and that he told them to punish him however they see fit. Nirmal said that they arrived at the wooded area in New Jersey and Sourav and Gurdeep exited the car with Kuldeep. Nirmal said that they entered the woods and he believes that he heard 3

gunshots. He said that only Sourav and Gurdeep returned to the car. He said that Kuldeep never exited the wooded area. Nirmal said that they then traveled back towards home. He said that a few minutes before they were stopped for a moving violation by police in New Jersey, Sandeep exited the car and entered a taxi to return him to New York. He said that they proceeded on to a residence in Parsippany. He said that they returned to Indiana a few days later.

Case detectives conducted an interview of suspect Gurdeep Singh, which was led by Trooper Singh. Miranda was read in Punjabi and waived by this individual. During the interview, Gurdeep Singh initially denied knowing Kuldeep and having any knowledge of his disappearance. When presented with contradictory evidence, Gurdeep detailed that he, Sourav, and Nirmal traveled from Indiana to NY to meet up with Kuldeep. The three men retrieved the Audi Q8 from Vineland and began making their way to NY. On the way, Gurdeep stated Sourav had a phone conversation with Sandeep but did not know what was spoken about. It should be noted that Gurdeep stated that Sourav was in possession of a handgun in a cross-body bag. They then arrived at Sandeep's residence in Queens where Sandeep drove the vehicle with Nirmal to go pick up Kuldeep. Sourav and Gurdeep exited the vehicle at Sandeep's house and walked to a nearby park. Once Sandeep picked up Kuldeep, they traveled to the park to meet Sourav and Gurdeep. Once there, Sandeep exited the vehicle and remained behind. Sourav entered the driver seat and Gurdeep entered the backseat with Kuldeep. The four men began driving to NJ, ultimately traveling to the crime scene. On the way, Gurdeep stated that Kuldeep was instigating Sourav about having pictures of his deceased sister. When they arrived in Manchester, Gurdeep stated they parked on the shoulder and exited the vehicle. Gurdeep recalled seeing the vehicle's lights flash, indicating that Sourav locked the vehicle. The men then began to walk into the woods and they were "dead silent.". While walking, Gurdeep stated that Kuldeep told Sourav that he was going to kill himself and blame him for it. At this point, Gurdeep stated that Sourav shot Kuldeep 2-3 times. Gurdeep stated that after hearing the gunshots then three men got spooked and ran back to the vehicle. Gurdeep stated that while driving away from the crime scene all the men were "shook up." When they were eventually stopped by Hightstown PD, Gurdeep thought they were caught and stated that he almost had a panic attack. The men then eventually returned the Audi Q8 and traveled to Indiana. At some point, Sourav had told Gurdeep that he threw the gun out of the car window off of a bridge, but did not know where or when.

Case detectives conducted an interview of Gourav Gourav, which was led by Trooper Singh. Nothing of evidentiary value was obtained and the Gourav was released from custody.

Case detectives conducted an interview of Ravinder Singh, which was led by Trooper Singh. Nothing of evidentiary value was obtained and the Ravinder was released from custody.

On Friday, December 20, 2024 the facts of the investigation were reviewed with the Supervising Assistant Prosecutor Meghan O'Neill. As a result of the investigation, Supervising Assistant Prosecutor Meghan O'Neill authorized the following criminal complaints for Gurdeep Singh: Murder—2C:11-3a(1), (2) and Conspiracy to Commit murder—2C:5-2 and 2C:11-3a(1), (2) and for Nirmal Singh: 2C:11-3a(1), (2) and Conspiracy to Commit murder—2C:5-2 and 2C:11-3a(1).
